

### EARLY SEASON APPLES



### **PRISTINE**

This beautiful sweet and tart, early apple, has gorgeous yellow skin with a moderate blush. The fresh, juicy flesh has an excellent crisp texture.





#### **SWEET MAIA**

This cross between a Honeycrisp and a Winecrisp apple originated in a seedling lot, first fruiting in 2009. It stands out as an early season apple with fall apple qualities. Featuring bright attractive red color, it is crispy and sweet. It also boasts a storage life of 90 days in common refrigerated storage!





### **SILKEN**

This early fall apple is noted for its unique porcelain color and outstanding texture and flavor. It is firm, extremely crisp and also very juicy and mild.





### **SANSA**


This beautiful Japanese apple is a cross between Gala and Akane varieties. As a sweet dessert apple, Sansa is said to have hints of cane sugar, grapes and sugared grapefruit.





### **HONEYCRISP**

As its name implies, this favorite fresh eating apple has an exceptionally crisp and juicy texture, and an outstanding honey flavored sweetness. As you bite into the cream-colored flesh, the large cells explode with juice in your mouth. This offspring of Keepsake was developed in Minnesota in 1991.








# MID SEASON APPLES



### **MCINTOSH**

This very popular apple has a white, tender, crisp flesh that's spicy, highly aromatic, and full of juice. It was named after John McIntosh, a farmer in Ontario, Canada who found and introduced it in 1870. Macs are the best selling apple in New England and Canada!





### **GOLDEN SUPREME**

Golden Supremes' flesh is crisp, coarsegrained, and light yellow. With many of the honey-and-pear qualities of a Golden Delicious, the flavor is sweet and balanced. Its firm and juicy flesh is pleasing to the palate and great for fresh eating, baking and cider.





### **SHIZUKA**

This apple has the same parentage as the Mutsu, but its flavor is a bit sweeter. Shizukas are firm and juicy, and are slow to brown once cut, making them ideal for salads.





### **CRESTON**

This crisp and very juicy, firm apple has a sweet flavor reminiscent of its parent, Golden Delicious. The mild flavors of pear, melon, and honey are backed by a wonderful balance of sweet and tart and very low acidity.

### **KEEPSAKE**

This "antique looking" firm apple has a very crisp, juicy, light yellow flesh. Keepsake has a melon like aroma and is wonderful for fresh eating or baking. Keepsake was introduced in 1979 as a cross of Malinda and Northern Spy, and is a parent to the famous Honeycrisp.





### **BALDWIN**

This old favorite New England apple has been known as a standard all purpose apple with a sweet, crisp, juicy yellow flesh. Baldwin's have excellent flavor and keep until spring. Baldwin is also known as" butter apple" or "woodpecker" and was found around 1740 in Wilmington, MA!

### **CRIMSON CRISP**

Crimson Crisp is a very firm and crunchy deep red apple. Its crispy yellow flesh holds a sweet-tart flavor, making it a great fresh-eating apple as well as a juice or cider variety.





### **CRIMSON GOLD**


This small but outstanding apple is a descendant of two heirloom varieties, Yellow Newton and Esopus Spitzenburg. They exhibit a firm, succulent, and crisp texture. 'Crimson Gold' aptly describes the lovely outer color and the warm, sweet taste.





### **CRIMSON TOPAZ**

This crisp, juicy, firm apple is a cross of Robin and Vanda and is very similar to the Honeycrisp (some even say it's better!). With a cream colored flesh, the Crimson Topaz is often favored by those who love sharper tasting apples.





### **NOVA SPY**

This apple has a sweet, vanilla-like flavor making it very good for fresh eating. It also bakes well and makes a great cider. This Northern Spy variety is from Nova Scotia and was introduced in 1995.

### **ASHMEAD'S KERNEL**

Introduced in the early 1700's, Ashmead's Kernel is an old English variety originating from Gloucestershire, UK. What it lacks in looks, this old, leathery English apples makes up for in flavor – spicy, complex, tart and intense.





### BELLE DE BOSKOOP

Belle de Boskoop originated from Boskoop, Netherlands in the 1850's. It is a dual-purpose apple, suitable for both dessert and culinary uses, & keeps it shape when cooked. It has a sharp flavor and firm flesh.





### **ESOPUS SPITZENBURG**

This high quality, dessert apple has a rich sharpness and a buttery, dense, yellow flesh. They have excellent flavor which improves with storage and are also known to be an excellent hard cider apple. The Spitzenberg was Thomas Jefferson's favorite apple and was found in the late 1700s in the Hudson Valley.

### **COX'S ORANGE PIPPIN**

Highly regarded due to its excellent flavor. Its flesh is very aromatic, yellow-white, fine-grained, crispy, and juicy.

#### **CHESTNUT**



This wonderfully russeted apple has a sweet, nutty flesh and crunchy bite. Late season and oblong shaped, Hudson's Golden Gem is an excellent chance seedling that originated in Oregon midway through the 20th century.







## NEW APPLES



#### **EVERCRISP**

An American apple cultivar developed by the Midwest Apple Improvement Association (MAIA). A cross between Honeycrisp and Fuji, EverCrisp have an in-your-face candied-apple sweetness, with a background tang and monstrous crunch.





### **ROSALEE**

This apple was developed by the MAIA. An offspring of Honeycrisp and Fuji, this apple has a clean, floral taste with spectacular texture.
